


# National curriculum tests


End of KS2



- Children in year 6 will be taking the national curriculum tests (commonly called the SATs)
  - They are not qualifications and will not affect your child's future options.
  - The results are an opportunity to compare pupils nationally and to ensure schools are helping children master the basics in English and maths.

<b>Date</b>	<b>Subject</b>	<b>Test papers</b>
<b>Monday 12 May</b>	English grammar, punctuation and spelling	Paper 1: Questions Paper 2: Spelling
<b>Tuesday 13 May</b>	English reading	English reading
<b>Wednesday 14 May</b>	Mathematics	Paper 1: Arithmetic Paper 2: Reasoning
<b>Thursday 15 May</b>	Mathematics	Paper 3: Reasoning

- By the end of the summer term you should receive the results for your child in English reading, English grammar, punctuation and spelling and mathematics .
  - You will receive separate teacher assessment judgements for English writing, English reading, English grammar, punctuation and spelling, mathematics and Science.
  - As there is no test for writing and science this will be reported as a teacher assessment only.

# Scaled scores


Key Stage 2 tests: ( Reading, <u>SPaG</u> , maths)		
Raw score	Scaled score	Performance descriptor
Range of raw test scores below threshold for meeting expected standard	80-99	NS – expected standard not achieved
Range of raw scores which indicates pupil has met standard	100 - 120	AS – expected standard achieved
Range of raw scores which show pupil is working at a higher level within the expected standard	110 -120	Higher Standard

Tests and teacher assessment (TA) are different forms of assessment; they do not report using the same scale so **no scaled score equivalents to the TA concepts of WTS or GDS**

# What can you do?

- Keep the children relaxed and calm.
- Ensure a good night's sleep
- Ensure your child has a large healthy breakfast
- Keep reading and learning spellings and timestables with the children.
